COVID SAFETY AQUILA

GENERAL

1. WHAT WILL BE THE RULES?

- a. The rules may change but we must follow the current Scout Association rules
- b. We also consider overall rates of infection
- c. Covid safety and procedures are to be approved by all leaders and all parents of scouts /YLs
- d. Specific points for camping are in a separate section.
- e. Outdoor and indoor activities possible

2. Reduce Risk of infection transmission

- a. Clear instructions will be given to all parents / guardians prior to meetings. Instructions to be issued to parents in advance of each meeting,
- b. The parent instructions will clearly state that no leader or young person should attend the activity if showing symptoms of COVID-19. If any leader / young person shows any symptoms of the above during the activity they need to be isolated and will either go home or parents contacted to arrange collection. Leaders / parents should follow government guidance if symptoms are present. i. stay at home / go home and arrange to have a test.
- c. In the event of a positive test, the group must be able to provide contact information to the government Track and Trace system, in order to isolate and contain any further infection. As a group we will log and maintain activity registers

3. Indoor meetings

- a. Only at the Scout hut
- b. Ventilation will be improved by extraction fans, windows and doors
- c. If not possible, masks must be worn and social distancing
- d. Active games and activities will be moved to Wick, wherever and whenever possible

CAMPING – LEES WOOD

1. General

- a. Each Troop is a bubble and remains separate from other troops: no mixing
- b. We have a designated area of the site and must remain within that: see Toilet and transport, below
- c. Social distancing where possible
- d. If in an enclosed tent during the day, then masks should be worn
- e. This does not apply to sleeping tents

2. Toilet and wash facilities

- a. We have a separate toilet / wash facility and this must be used at all times
- b. The Campsite Toilet Blocks will be well ventilated and cleaned regularly.

3. Testing

- a. As it stands, all are encouraged to test, but not compulsory
- b. Immediately before camp, parents (and adults) must declare free of Covid, either by lateral flow test or stating free of symptoms. All campers must NOT be isolating
- c. If someone exhibits symptoms during, they should be tested using a lateral flow test.
- d. If positive then they should return home and follow government guidance to self-isolate and receive further testing. tent-sharers of positive case must return home.
- e. A designated leader will control and supervise testing.
- f. Used tests will be disposed of as the instructions, but all tests in their own bags, put into a single bag for site disposal

4. Transport

- a. For local camps, parents transport scouts
- b. At the campsite, cars must park in the area designated for us. Parents should remain with cars.
- c. Leader-driven vehicles will be used at about half capacity

5. During the camp

- a. No indoor activities planned
- b. Troop will have extra masks available
- c. Hand wash and gel available at all times, particularly before food handling
- d. Eating utensils and mugs will not be shared

6. Tents

- a. Use dining shelter, tarps or event shelter when possible for shelter
- b. both ends and windows all open in mess tent to ensure good ventilation
- c. If troop must be enclosed (eg doors of mess tent closed), then masks are worn.
- d. Scouts must not go into another sleeping tent
- e. Scouts will have 6 or less per tent
- f. Adults will be single occupancy
